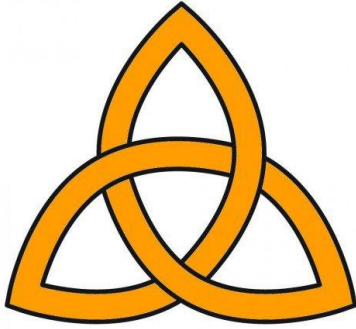


Our Lady of Loretto and St Michael

With the two tablets of stone in his hands, Moses went up
the mountain of Sinai in the early morning as the Lord had

him and proclaimed, 'Lord, Lord, a God of tenderness and

faithfulness.' And Moses bowed down to the ground at

are a headstrong people, but forgive us our faults and our

The Nicene Creed

I believe in one God,
the Father almighty,
maker of heaven and earth,
of all things visible and invisible.

begotten, not made,
consubstantial with the Father;

he suffered death and was buried,
and rose again on the third day

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again in glory
to judge the living and the dead
and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who
proceeds from the Father and the Son,

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.
I confess one baptism for the forgiveness of sins
